on-line or other activities for a 15-week semester, which includes two weeks

for final exams.

COURSE PREREQUISITES: ABA 101 and ABA 200

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Instructional:

This course will build upon content from ABA 100, 101 and 200 and allows students to observe and document the application of behavioural principles in a real world setting of their choosing by following a particular client or program. These placements may include one of the following: preschool, school, adult, or recreational settings. Upon completion of the course, the student will be able to do the following:

- 1) Identify and explain multiple target behaviours for skill acquisition and/or reduction in an individual
- 2) Identify explain, and use multiple examples of reinforcement, schedules of reinforcement, and antecedent manipulations for an individual
- 3) Identify, explain, and use multiple examples of shaping, chaining, and/or fading for an individual
- 4) Demonstrate the use of multiple types of data collection systems for an individual
- 5) Identify and explain multiple examples of maintenance and/or generalization for an individual

REQUIRED TEXTS & MATERIALS:

COURSE CONTENT: This course will introduce students to the application of basic principles of the

science of behaviour in a real world clinical setting. Students will collect observational data over the course of the term for a target client or program.

Practicum supervisors will be asked to report on any student conduct that is concerning. Any instances of unprofessional conduct will be reflected in your mark.

If you miss a class/observation, you will fail to earn the possible points/marks for that session. Exceptions <u>may</u> be made by the instructor on an individual and case-by-case basis, but only if s/he is contacted well in advance of class/observation time and the absence is approved before the class/session begins.

Students will earn attendance and participation points/marks as per the course outline.

Cheating and Plagiarism:

The ABA – Autism department adheres to the definition of cheating and plagiarism found in the University website which students are responsible for consulting. Cheating and plagiarism may result in a grade of zero, either for the assignment or the entire course.

Missed Exams:

Make-up exams are given only in exceptional circumstances and with <u>prior</u> notice to the instructor. A penalty of up to 20% will be levied on those make-up exams when granted.

Submissions for waiver of late penalties for exceptional circumstances may be presented, in writing, to the ABA – Autism Department.

Late Assignments:

Due dates for papers and assignments will be announced and guidelines will be distributed in class.

All papers must be submitted directly to the instructor at the beginning of the class period. Late papers will be penalized 20% for up to one week. No papers will be accepted later than this one week except under exceptional

circumstances.

Incomplete Grades:

Incomplete grades will be given <u>only</u> in exceptional circumstances, and require the approval of the ABA - Autism Department rather than your instructor.

English Usage:

All assignments must be original and must be used for this course only. Keep copies of all drafts, including copies on disk labelled "Draft1," "Draft2," etc.

<u>Hand in the original which must be typed</u>. For written assignments, you may be required to go to the Writing Centre as part of a revision process.

Confidentiality:

The ABA – Autism department adheres to professional standards of ethics and confidentiality. Personal information that you give to an instructor would not normally be shared with anyone outside the department without your authorization. However, there are a few exceptional circumstances in which an instructor may be required by law to disclose information about you, e.g. if there is an indication that a minor (under the age of 19) is being abused sexually or physically, or neglected; or, disclosure of information is made necessary for legal proceedings; and certain other circumstances about which you may inquire.

Electronic Devices:

During Exams: No personal electronic devices (cell phones, tablets, laptops, pagers, calculators, electronic dictionaries, etc.) may be used during an examination without prior approval from the instructor. During an exam, turn off all cell phones and pagers and remove them from the desk.

During Class: No personal electronic devices (cell phones, tablets, laptops) may be used during class. Cell phones must be turned off and put away. Handout packages and assigned readings, purchased through the bookstore, provided electronically, and/or provided by your Instructors (at cost), must be brought to class. Students observed using an electronic device during class will automatically lose their attendance/participation points for the class.

<u>Activity Log and Supervisor Evaluation:</u> Each student will be required to complete an activity log and obtain supervisor feedback via an evaluation form at the end of each observation session.

<u>Observation Summary Sheets</u>: Students will be provided with a template to guide their observations in each practicum setting. Students will be expected to return with a type-written (Times New Roman, size 12 font, double spaced) observation summary sheet to share with their group members and the Instructor.

Reading Summary: Each student will be required to search for a total of three research articles related to their practicum placement, write a brief 1 page summary, and be prepared to discuss their article in class with their peers and the Instructor.
