Based on knowledge and experience gained throughout the program, students will complete and present a graduation portfolio containing key elements of an event plan including, but not limited to, an event proposal, a budget, a marketing plan and a sponsorship proposal or grant application. Students will also

write an article on an industry topic as assigned.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- demonstrate competency with respect to all aspects of the creation, production and dissemination of an artistic project;
- discuss arts and entertainment in the context of wider society and its economic and political trends;
- employ principles of effective written and oral communication;
- evaluate the operation of an arts/entertainment project to determine the strengths and weaknesses; and
- explain key concepts regarding planning, funding, producing, budgeting and promoting and arts and entertainment event.
