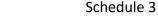
7. Committee Reports

7.1 Academic Planning and Program Review Committee Presented by: Alaa Al-Musalli

The committee met on November 12, 2024, and reviewed the 1-Year progress report from Jazz Studies, which covered the successful implementation of the recommendations from the 2021/22 review of three programs, namely, Jazz Studies Diploma; Bachelor of Music in Jazz studies – Performance/Composition, and Bachelor of Music in Jazz Studies – Education.

At the committee meeting, Claire Carolan, Aurelea Mahood and Maryam Babu provided an orientation from Academic Initiatives and Planning (AIP) and a cyclical review celebrating the important history of the work done over the years. CARRIED

7.4 Teaching and Learning Committee

The Committee met on November 19, 2024, and received several reports, including the following highlights:

- The Centre for Teaching Excellence is working on a renewal of their mission and vision.
- A report on the digital learning framework will be brought to the committee.
- The Faculty Research Symposium will take place on Friday, April 25, 2025, and the Student Research Symposium will take place on Saturday, April 26, 2025.
- Results will go out this week for the annual CARS Unified Grant and 24 faculty awards will be announced. Ten faculty will receive section release in addition to research assistant funding.
- The NSERC Mobilize Grant call has ended, and 15 applications were received for five grants.
- Academic Initiatives and Planning (AIP) are working on CIP (classification of instructional programs) code adjustments to make sure all Capilano programs align with government requirements.

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- A request for proposal (RFP) is being developed collaboratively with other institutions for a curriculum management system.
- Work on Masters' programs is ongoing and it is anticipated that it will be approximately two years before the three programs in progress are launched.
