## 4. BIOLOGY

BIOL 120 - Environmental Field Studies

BIOL 120 – Environmental Field Studies is a new course that will be held over two weeks in the Howe Sound or Sunshine Coast region. It will introduce students to the biodiversity of our local region and explore how human interactions shape the environment. The course emphasizes place-based experiential learning and problem solving within groups and is a general elective course without prerequisites, which enables access to diverse students seeking scientific field experience and the opportunity to work with their peers in regional natural spaces.
