COURSE DESCRIPTION

Over the course of one term, students will work with a faculty member with relevant subject area expertise to guide them in the development of a research-based project or approved creative equivalent. This 4500-6000 word project, or approved equivalent, will evolve from a synthesis of the topics and questions explored in their three Liberal Studies Tutorials. Specific course details will be arranged between individual students and faculty members. Registration is by permission of the instructor and the Liberal Studies degree coordinator.
