PROGRAM AND POSITION DESCRIPTION:

The Indigenous Peer Mentorship program will support new students in the University One for Aboriginal Learners Certificate Program in their transition to university life. Each new University One student will be matched with a Peer Mentor to lead and support them during their first semester. As a Peer Mentor, you will share your experiences and introduce incoming students to the opportunities, programs and services available at Capilano University. Peer Mentors will meet with their matched mentee bi-weekly to provide support, encouragement and foster a sense of belonging.

- Assist mentees in overcoming barriers (academic, social, financial and institutional) by sharing your own experiences navigating campus resources leading to your success as a student
- Encourage mentees to be involved with campus activities, student life, and the Kéxwusm-áyakn Student Centre by attending various events with mentee
- Organize and lead meetings and events to address the needs of mentees
- Assist mentee with developing skills and strategies to attain academic goals
- Maintain documentation of all meetings with your mentee and submit to coordinator on a monthly basis
- Attend monthly check-in meeting with program coordinator
